The CIEH (Chartered Institute of Environmental health) Level 2 Award in Food Safety in Catering is a successor to the CIEH Basic/Foundation food safety course. The course covers many different topics including legislation, food safety hazards, chilling, cooking, cleaning equipment and develops a level of understanding for food handlers to enable them to improve standards and help prevent food poisoning.
