Ring making will serve as an introduction to the process of measuring, sawing, joining, texturing, basic forming, finishing and polishing. All these will be discussed at the first class with health and safety information.

Tools to Bring (only if you have them)

- Piercing Frame Saw, 5" adjustable

- Half round smooth jawed pliers
- Spring reverse action insulated tweezers
- Borax, borax dish and brush

- Soldering block
- Butane hand held torch (like a hand-held kitchen torch)
- Refill

- Raw hide or nylon hammer or wood

- 8" half round cut2 (smooth) file or a set of needle files approx snipes
- Silvo silver polish and cotton rag
- Ring mandrel
- Parallel pliers

- Drawing/notebook
- Pencil, rubber
- Apron, old clothes / tea towel for drying
- Safety Goggles and face mask (dust and fume protection)
