# Stained-Glass: Copperfoil

During the course you will learn about the materials and processes used to make small scale stained glass pieces. We will also learn how to use a grinder, glass cutter, soldering iron and patina. All these will be discussed at the first class with health and safety information. You will build up knowledge of techniques to produce a small scale two dimensional glass panel or mirror.
